#### Vice – Chancellor inaugurated B.F. Tech final examination at KVK, Sandhiyur

Our Vice - Chancellor, Dr.P. Murugesa Boopathi, inaugurated the final examination for I year I semester B. F. Tech. course at KVK, Sandhiyur on 7.5.2011. During the occasion, he said that among 811akh farm families in Tamil Nadu, 65% of them are small and marginal farmers, 15 % medium farmers and only 5% of them are big farmers. About 60% of the people in villages were school drop outs and they are not aware of new varieties, new farm implements and new technologies. He also said that in order to make the farmers





graduates, the B. F. Tech. degree course was introduced through the Directorate of Open and Distance Learning. He opined that the 743 new varieties and 149 new farm implements introduced from the University taught in this degree programme will be disseminated to the fellow farmers for the benefit of farming community.

Agronomy, Soil Science, Horticulture, Entomology, Marketing of Agricultural products, Agricultural Engineering, Sericulture and food processing courses along with theory, practical and demonstrations will be conducted in B. F. Tech. degree course. This course is being offered at six centres viz., Salem, Coimbatore, Madurai, Killikulam, Aduthurai and Tindivanam.

## **Employment opportunities** for farm graduates

During the month of May 2011, six campus interviews were conducted, wherein three Banking sectors and three Multi National Agro-based industries participated. Totally 581 students from the constituent colleges of TNAU have attended the campus Interview.
