A survey has been made on the performance of the newly released variety TNAU Co (BG) 6 in the farmers' fields. On 08.04.11, Mr. V. Balasubramanian, JDA, Mr. S. Rajkumar, DD (State schemes), Mr. G. Ramadoss, DD, (Central Schemes) and Mr. Eswaran A.O (State schemes) along with Dr. B. Chandrasekaran, Professor and Head, SWMRI, Mr. Pankaj singh, Consultant CSISA Project have visited the field trials in the farmers holdings at Thirukattupalli, Soorakottai and Vandayariruppu and observed the performance of TNAU Co (BG) 6 Black gram in CSISA and FPARP project trials. The farmers were satisfied and pointed out the benefits of the variety in comparison with the other varieties like T 9, ADT 5 and ADT 3 blackgrams. The farmers were recommended to spray pulse wonder or DAP to augment flower retention, more pod formation and for more yield.
