Weather Summary and forecast for Ariyalur district

General		Farmers are advised to provide adequate drainage facilities to all crops due to light to moderate rainfall forecast.			

		Link the drainage channel with farm ponds towards efficient water drainage besides the rain water storage.
		Avoid application of fertilizers and insecticides to the crops.
Cotton	Harvest	Pick the matured cotton boles before rain.
Banana		Provide support with wooden poles to avoid lodging of tree due to rain and wind.
Sugarcane		To avoid lodging due to heavy rain, detrashing and propping of five month old sugarcane is recommended.
Cattle	Cow and Goat	Exposure of calves and kids to rain should be avoided to prevent from pneumonia attack in view of expected high rain.
