In the above reference cited SLSC has approved the project "Programme on Oilseeds Mission" with a financial allocation of Rs.810 lakhs. The components under the project and pattern of subsidy are given below.

| Application of Pusa hydrogel             | 50% to the maximum of Rs.2500/ha             |

As it is approved by the SLSC, the District Joint Directors of Agriculture are requested to **Go-ahead** with the scheme such as Identification and selection of beneficiaries for distribution of inputs following the guidelines communicated for implementation of NMOOP, Mini-Mission – I Oilseeds except the category wise allocation. The District wise , Component wise, Season wise , Quarter wise Category wise Physical and Financial targets are enclosed. The Joint Directors of Agriculture are instructed to select the beneficiaries and incur expenditure as per the targets communicated for different category i.e., General, SC and ST.

It is also requested to send monthly progress report with the head of account wise expenditure and No of beneficiaries on or before 5<sup>th</sup> of every month.

## **Minutes of the SSI meeting held on 16.6.2014 with the representatives from private Sugar mills in the New conference hall of the Directorate of Agriculture**

A meeting to discuss on the modalities of the Sustainable Sugarcane Initiatives for the year 2014-15 was held on 16.6.2014 in the new conference hall of the Directorate of Agriculture on 16.6.2014 by 11 AM.

Deputy Directors of Agriculture/AO (GOI) from the concerned districts and representatives from private sugar mills participated in the meeting. The list of participants is appended.

Deputy Director (cotton & sugarcane) presided over the meeting and discussed on the key issues in implementing the SSI during 2014-15. The general scenario of the Sugarcane area coverage, production and productivity of the last year and current year programme were discussed. The importance of SSI scheme in Sugarcane cultivation and the progress made so far from the inception of the programme was highlighted.

Strategies to bring about 5000 Ha in SSI with an impact area of 10000Ha for the current year 2014-15 were discussed. Out of this 5000Ha, implementation of SSI in an Area of 2000Ha covered by 18 Co-operative/Public sugar mills will be looked after by the Director of Sugars and an area of 3000Ha to be covered by 25 private sugar mills will be monitored by Director of Agriculture.

DDA (CDC) also highlighted the details on the inputs and subsidy available in the scheme and informed the forum about the revised NMSA guidelines and requested the concerned sugar mills to co-ordinate with the JDAs of the respective Districts in scheme implementation. This was followed by a discussion session with the District officials and private sugar mill representatives and the targets for the SSI 2014-15 is fixed. Moreover the Mill wise / District wise availability of shade nets and those fit for use was assessed. The details are tabulated and given below: Since there is enough shade nets available with the mills, there is no further demand for new shade nets for the year 2014-15 for the private mill

**The following agenda points were discussed with the district officials and private mill representatives for implementation of SSI during 2014-15**

- Sugar Mill has to maintain schedule of calendar of each operation from planting to harvest even up to the last ratoon crop. Accordingly, arrangements to install drip irrigation system, supply of critical inputs and mechanization shall be done.
- Identification and collection of complete profile of each beneficiary will be done by the respective sugar mills.
- The list of beneficiaries with tentative schedule of plantation shall be furnished to Director of Agriculture one month before so that necessary approval to lay the drip irrigation system can be done before planting of seedlings.
- As there is a chance for deviation of 10% of farmers, the list of replacement farmers from the same village/block shall also be identified and reported to Director of Agriculture at least one month before laying micro irrigation system.
- Water Soluble fertilizer shall be made available to the farmers through respective cane extension officer duly monitored by Agriculture Department officials.
- All the extension activities required for implementation of SSI activities shall be done by the Cane officials of the individual sugar mills concerned.
- Efforts shall be made to identify a cluster of 50 acres or above and ensure mechanized planting in order to facilitate mechanical harvesting.
- Documentation of the each activity from planting to harvesting shall also be done by the respective sugar mills.
- The concerned Joint Directors of Agriculture will be responsible for monitoring these works with the private sugar mills in their area.

**The representatives of the private sugar mills made the following suggestions for effective implementation of the scheme:**

1. At present, subsidy is extended for supply of WSF and other critical inputs such as seedlings, MN mixture, weedicide, biofertilizer, TNAU sugarcane booster and FYM. This may be restricted to Water Soluble Fertilizer (Mandatory) and Single budded seedlings only.

2. The district officials find difficult to implement the scheme with the present subsidy limitation of supply of critical input to 1 ha/farmer. The subsidy may be extended to 5 Ha/ farmer for installation of micro irrigation system, as per present guidelines the same may be adopted for SSI for effective implementation.

Finally, DDA (CDC) informed the forum that the G.O is expected shortly and requested all stake holders to take up the targeted SSI work as per schedule.

The meeting ended with vote of thanks.

In the reference (1) cited, the Government of India has communicated the approval of Annual Action Plan for Mini Mission –I Oilseeds for the year 2014-15.

In the guidelines communicated vide reference (2) cited, the rate of assistance for certain components such as Plant Protection equipments, Supply of improved farm implements and sprinklers has two subsidy patterns one for SC/ST/ Small/ Marginal/ Women and another for other farmers.

As the operational holdings of other farmers (other than SC/ST/ Small/ Marginal/ Women farmers) is only around 2% , the District Joint Directors of Agriculture are requested to adopt the subsidy pattern prescribed for SC/ST/ Small/ Marginal/ Women farmers) for all the components under Mini Mission-I. In case if other farmers (except SC/ST/ Small/ Marginal/ Women farmers) approach the officials for the components such Distribution of PP equipments Supply of improved farm implements and sprinklers under NMOOP –Oilseeds, the District Joint Directors of Agriculture should adopt the subsidy pattern prescribed for other farmers.

The district wise, component wise and quarter wise disaggregation targets and subsidy pattern to be adopted for the components under NMOOP-Oilseeds is enclosed.
