National level Beekeeping Development Committee meeting of Economic Advisory Council to Prime Minister (EAC-PM) conducted at TNAU, Coimbatore

The Economic Advisory Council to Prime Minister (EAC-PM) of India conducted the Beekeeping Development Committee meeting at Tamil Nadu Agricultural University (TNAU), Coimbatore on 5-9-2018. The meeting was organised by the Department of Agricultural Entomology which was chaired by Padma Shri Dr. Bibek Debroy, Chairman, EAC-PM and member NITI Aayog, Government of India.

Mr. Ratan P Watal, Member Secretary, EAC-PM and Principal Advisor for Social Sector, NITI Aayog, GOI, Dr. K. Ramasamy, Vice-Chancellor of TNAU, Mr. Rajeswara Rao, Adviser, EAC-PM, Dr. B.L.
