## TNAU Conducts 25th Annual Post Graduate Advisory meeting of the DBT sponsored M.Sc.(Biotechnology) programme

The 25th Annual Post Graduate Advisory Committee meeting of the DBT sponsored M.Sc.(Biotechnology) programme was conducting at the Center for Plant Molecular Biology & Biotechnology, TNAU, Coimbatore on 08.11.2024. Every year, the Department of Biotechnology, Govt. of India, New Delhi conducts an annual review meeting to assess the status of the M.Sc.(Biotech) degree programme at the Center for Plant Molecular Biology & Biotechnology, TNAU, Coimbatore.
